

Redeemer of Israel – Dot Words

How to Play:

- Sing through Redeemer of Israel once, before introducing the activity.
- Post the 2-page poster with your choice of with or without the words filled in.
- Ask the children what they notice. What patterns do they see?
- Sing through the song again and have them look and see if they can find any patterns.
- Pass out the 6 words randomly to the class or post them on the board. Have the kids listen carefully and try to figure out where their word will go in the blanks. After each time through the song, add one of the missing words.
- The dots represent “small” filler words, and the dashes represents more significant words. Then fill in the square boxes with the main keywords of the song!

Extension Activities:

- Skip singing the keywords. Then switch, skip singing the other words and sing only the keywords.
- Clap on the dashes (-) and pat on the dots (.)
- Add a different unique action for each of the 6 keywords.
- Cut out each of the song lines (3 word strips per page) and mix them up on the board. Have the kids help get them back in the correct order.
- Have the kids write-in the missing word or draw a picture to represent it, instead of using the provided word bank.
