

Grandmother Primary Song Hot Potato Game

Pass around an object while you sing this Mother's Day song. When you stop, have the child share something they love about their grandma!

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How to Play:

1. Bring an object to primary that can easily be passed around. Some ideas might include a bean bag, a shoe, a potato, or even just a piece of paper works! You can grab a cute hot potato printable from our website.
2. At the beginning of primary, review the first two verses of Grandmother primary song.
3. Then, start passing an object around the room. Have each of the children pass the object to someone sitting next to them while you sing.
4. Have the pianist stop the music randomly during the song. When the music stops, the “hot potato” stops too!
5. Ask the child who is holding the hot potato to share something they love about their grandmother.
6. Continue singing until the music stops again! Have the children share about their grandmothers.
7. Finish with your testimony of families.

Extension Activities:

- Invite children to share about other meaningful people in their lives. You can replace the word “Grandmother” in the song with “Mother,” “Father,” “Sister,” “Brother,” or “Friend.” Have children share what they love about the people they love!
- Assign each question a number 1-6. Pass around a numbered dice. When the music stops, have the child holding the dice roll it and answer the question assigned to that number.
- Have the children pass the item on specific key words in the song or have them pass it on every word.

Grandmother Primary Song Hot Potato Questions

Here are some fun “Hot Potato” questions to get you started! When the song stops, ask one of these questions to the child holding the item. Remember, you can always substitute “Grandmother” for another family member they would like to share about.

What is your favorite thing about your grandmother?

Share a favorite memory of your grandmother.

What is something your grandmother does to show her love for you?

What is something you can do to show love to your grandmother?

What is your grandmother’s favorite activity to do?

Does your grandmother have a favorite hymn or primary song?

What is your grandmother’s favorite color?

What is something you have learned from your grandmother?

What is one of your grandmother’s talents?



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
