Easter Hosanna Song Story

Samuel the Lamanite was commanded to preach to the Nephites. The people were very angry at him, so they cast him out. Samuel came back and was protected by God as He prophesied that Jesus Christ would be born in 5 years. He also prophesied about Christ's death and told the people that Jesus would be resurrected.

Sing: "The prophesies of long ago were now at last fulfilled"

Many years later, these prophesies came true. The land was dark for three days, and the Nephites were afraid. Heavenly father spoke to them three times. Finally, they were able to hear his voice. Heavenly father said, "Behold my Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased, in whom I have glorified my name - hear ye him."

Sing: "When Jesus, risen from the dead, to man Himself revealed."

3 Nephi II:8 says, "And it came to pass, as they understood they cast their eyes up again towards heaven; and they saw a Man descending out of heaven; and he was clothed in a white robe; and he came down and stood in the midst of them."

Sing: "As he came down from heav'n above, white robed and glorified,"

The Nephites remembered the prophesies of Samuel the Lamanite and knew that it was Jesus. Jesus invited the Nephites to come feel the nail prints in his hands and side. The people felt his love and shouted for joy!

Sing: "The people of the promised land received their Lord and cried:"

Even though we have not touched Christ's hands, we know that he was resurrected. Jesus overcame death so that we can one day be resurrected too.

> Sing: "Hosanna! Blessed be the name of the Most High God! Hosanna! Blessed be the name of the Most High God!"
